



**Boarding School Regulations**  
of the Palucca University of Dance Dresden  
from January 01, 2026

Pursuant to Section 88 (2) sentence 1 and Section 14 (5) sentence 1 of the law of the universities in the Free State of Saxony (Sächsisches Hochschulgesetz ([Saxon Law of University]) - SächsHSG) from May 31, 2023, Official Gazette of the Free State of Saxony (SächsGVBl. p. 329), last amended by Article 2 of the Law from January 31, 2024 (SächsGVBl. p. 83) the Rectorate of the Palucca University of Dance Dresden, by resolution of 18 December 2025, hereby enacts the following Boarding School Regulations:

In these regulations, gender-sensitive language is used. If gender-neutral formulations are not possible, the masculine and feminine forms are used. However, the wording applies equally to people of all gender identities.

## **Section 1 General Regulations**

(1) The boarding school is a facility run by the Palucca University of Dance Dresden. The University is a corporation under public law and is therefore, in all respects, subject to the provisions of the Youth Protection Act (Jugendschutzgesetz - JuSchG).

(2) The members of the boarding school (pupils, students, and dormitory guardians) constitute a community characterised by mutual respect, consideration, responsibility, and helpfulness.

(3) As a general rule, the opening hours of the boarding school are determined by the teaching and rehearsal schedule of the Palucca University of Dance Dresden. Depending on this rule, the boarding school is open on weekends and public holidays if required.

(4) Closing periods as well as arrival and departure dates before and after holiday periods shall be published in the annual schedule.

## **Section 2 Rules Governing Conduct in the Boarding School**

(1) Careful and proper use of the premises and furnishings of the boarding school is self-evident for all pupils and students. Everyone is jointly responsible for order and cleanliness within the boarding school, for respecting others, for mutual consideration, tolerance, helpfulness, and personal responsibility. This applies in particular to hygiene. Any damage must be reported to the dormitory guardians without delay. Older residents shall serve as role models for younger residents. The threat or use of psychological or physical violence is strictly prohibited.

(2) After attendance at school or university and on weekends, residents are subject to a mandatory sign-in and sign-out requirement. This also applies to stays on school grounds or on campus, especially in dance studios after the end of classes. If pupils or students do not intend to return directly to the boarding school after the end of classes, the team of dormitory guardians must be informed in advance.

(3) Room keys shall be collected from the dormitory guardians' office upon entering the boarding school and shall be returned there upon leaving the boarding school, except for the purpose of attending school. Boarding rooms must be locked as soon as all occupants have left the room.

(4) Noise is to be avoided as a matter of principle. Audio equipment must be operated at room volume, especially between 9 p.m. and 8 a.m.

(5) During the period of night rest, the use of electronic devices, in particular telephones, computers, laptops, and tablets, is prohibited.

(6) Leaving hours and the commencement of night rest are governed by the following schedule:

All residents must be in their rooms at least 30 minutes prior to the commencement of night rest. On days not followed by a school day, young persons who have reached the age of 16 may remain out until 12 a.m. midnight.

(7) Overnight stays outside the boarding school are generally prohibited. Exceptions require prior authorisation by the parents or legal guardians in written form or by email submitted to the boarding school.

(8) Guests must register with the team of the dormitory guardians and sign into the guest register. Visiting hours end 30 minutes prior to the respective period of night rest, but no later than 10 p.m.

(9) Any illness of a boarding school resident must be reported to the team of dormitory guardians without delay. Decisions regarding the continued stay in the boarding school shall be taken on a case-by-case basis.

(10) If arrival at the usual time on the day of arrival is not possible, the boarding school must be informed directly by the parents until 8 p.m. on the day in question. In addition, the information sheet on school and university attendance at the Palucca University of Dance Dresden and the secondary school must be observed.

(11) Food storage and eating meals are generally only permitted in the boarding school kitchens.

(12) Individual preparation of meals on weekdays is permitted only for students of the BAT classes, in the morning and in the evening, in the communal kitchen.

(13) In boarding rooms, it is prohibited to rearrange furniture, bring in additional furniture, affix stickers to doors or cupboards, or drill holes in walls. Bathmats are prohibited for hygiene reasons.

(14) The possession, use, and distribution of weapons and dangerous objects of any kind (e.g. firearms, slingshots, throwing, striking, cutting, and stabbing weapons, etc.) are prohibited.

(15) Theft, psychological or physical violence against persons, damage to property, and the consumption of intoxicating substances constitute violations of these Boarding School Regulations.

(16) The use of media of any kind that may endanger minors, in particular media containing content that is degrading to human dignity, pornographic, or racist, is prohibited in the boarding school. Responsibility for all content stored on mobile phones, private computers, or other image and sound storage media, as well as for any form of private mobile internet access, lies with the persons having parental responsibility.

(17) The creation and publication of images or audio recordings of persons is permitted only with the consent of the person concerned and, in the case of minors, only with the consent of the persons having parental responsibility.

(18) Any extraordinary incidents must be reported immediately to the dormitory guardian on duty.

(19) Boarding school residents are obliged to observe decisions taken by the dormitory guardians for the purpose of ensuring compliance with these Regulations and to follow corresponding instructions. Additional briefings shall be conducted at regular intervals and as required; acknowledgement of participation shall be confirmed by signature. This serves in particular to ensure order and safety, including fire safety.

### **Section 3 Fire Safety**

(1) Smoking, as well as the handling of open flames and open light sources (including incense candles and pyrotechnic articles), is strictly prohibited.

(2) Private electrical devices connected to the mains power supply may be operated, in accordance with the Accident Prevention Regulation "Electrical Systems and Equipment" (GUV 2.10), only if they are in a tested and operationally safe condition (test seal) and only with the approval of the dormitory guardians. The operation of electrical kitchen appliances (e.g. kettles, toasters) in boarding rooms is prohibited.

(3) In all other respects, the Fire Safety Regulations of the Palucca University of Dance Dresden shall apply.

### **Section 4 Valuables**

Valuables and larger amounts of cash may be deposited with the dormitory guardians for safekeeping. No liability can be accepted.

**Section 5**  
**Violations of the Boarding School Regulations**

(1) Compliance with these Regulations constitutes a prerequisite for a pupil's or student's continued residence in the boarding school.

(2) Violations of these Boarding School Regulations shall be addressed and sanctioned by the dormitory guardians. If a pupil or student is to be dismissed from the boarding school, the management of the University, the secondary school, and the boarding school shall coordinate their actions.

**Section 6**  
**Entry into Force**

These Regulations shall enter into force at the University on 1 January 2026. At the same time, the Boarding School Regulations dated 7 May 2010 shall cease to have effect.
